Changes to welfare benefits

Our February Forum will be about welfare benefits. Our speaker Odette Messiah, Information and Advice Team Leader for Age UK East London, will talk to members about these issues and the options available to assist you in your applications, if necessary.

The welfare benefits system is about to receive a major shake up which will drastically change arrangements. The government is now bringing in severe cuts which will affect the poorest and most vulnerable people in the country. Many changes to welfare benefits will come into effect from April 2013.

For many people who receive benefits there will be cuts that will leave them vulnerable: often the financial risks of moving into work will be hazardous. For some groups the gains of going into work, particularly on low hours, are small and any gain may easily be wiped out altogether by in-work costs such as transport. For some people the changes will be difficult and many people may experience frustration and inconvenience.

We anticipate an increase of anxiety and problems amongst DBU members.

We therefore want to remind members that the Hackney Information & Advice Consortium (HIAC) operates a service in 25 GP surgeries in Hackney dealing with issues such as Welfare Benefits, Housing and Debt for patients in their local practice on a weekly or fortnightly basis.

If you find yourself in difficulty you may want to contact your GP surgery to see whether they offer HIAC advice sessions.

If your surgery is not registered with HIAC you can contact other agencies such as Age UK Hackney, CAB, Hoxton Legal Trust, Hackney Law Centre etc... who may be able to help.

Warm Homes Project

Dave Monaghan from the Warm Home Project will come and talk to members about a programme available in Hackney. The programme is available to any older, vulnerable resident living in Tower Hamlets, Hackney and Newham. Warm Homes Project is funded to make 125 home visits in each borough.

The project started in early December and ends March 2013. The aim of the Warm Homes project is to enable older people to:

Change energy use behaviour Benefit from small practical measures Reduce energy bills

The project includes:

Carrying out a home energy check; Installing simple and practical energy efficiency measures - draught proofing, night lights, low energy bulbs, radiator reflector panels, socket timers.

All labour and materials are provided free. If you are interested in having simple changes made to your home that will help reduce your bills for example, then Dave will be available to take your details and book an appointment with you.

Mears Home Improvement

Mears Home Improvements Hackney works in partnership with Hackney Council and helps disabled and older people in Hackney to remain living independently.

Mears provide a free confidential advice, support and assistance to people aged 55 and over, people with diagnosed disabilities and their carers who are homeowners, private sector or social housing tenants.

The service is quite extensive and includes home safety checks, welfare benefits review, support in making grant application if you are eligible and inform of any financial help that may be available. Mears also provide a service which helps make your home fit your needs by providing adaptations such as ramps, stair lifts, hoists, external rails, specialist toileting facilities or level access showers.

End Street Clutter!

Following pressure from DBU, the Council is now considering a zero tolerance policy towards shop and restaurants' 'A' boards and similar street clutter, which pose a constant danger to people with visual impairments and obstacles to many disabled people with mobility or other impairments. The Council's Regulatory Committee has recommended such a policy and the Mayor and Cabinet will consider it shortly.

If you see examples of unnecessary clutter of this kind, please let us, or a local councillor, know, to lend force to the pressure to make our streets friendlier for disabled people to use.

Queen Elizabeth Park
